INTRODUCTION

Offshore Oil and Gas Drilling is the Single Largest Dedicated Funding Source of Conservation and Outdoor Recreation in the U.S.

A growing number of lawmakers and environmental groups have begun calling for a permanent ban on offshore oil and gas drilling. In March 2020, then presidential candidate Joe Biden declared, "No more drilling, including offshore, no ability for the oil industry to continue to drill, period." From Alaska to the West and East Coasts, anti-drilling proposals are becoming common place. In May of this year, California narrowly defeated a bill that would have permanently banned drilling in all of California's state

waters. At the federal level, the COAST Anti-Drilling Act (HR 3116 and S 1851) to ban offshore drilling on the outer Continental Shelf along the Atlantic Coast currently has 28 co-sponsors in the House and 15 in the Senate.

Much of the discussion about a ban on offshore oil and gas production has centered on how it will negatively impact our energy markets, especially with current tight supplies and elevated prices for oil and gas. But what is missing from the conversation – and which deserves just as much attention - is that this ban would have devastating impacts on the nation's ability to provide access to the great outdoors and critical wildlife conservation.

Here's why. Besides the fact that offshore oil and natural gas production currently adds approximately 315,000 jobs and Treasury, the bottom line is that offshore oil and gas drilling provides the largest dedicated source of funding for conservation and outdoor recreation in the U.S., funding all 50 states and territories.

Created by Congress in 1964, the Land and Water Conservation Fund (LWCF) currently accrues \$900 million annually in revenues, with nearly all derived from offshore oil and gas leasing. The LWCF was a bipartisan commitment to safeguard natural areas, water resources and our cultural heritage, and to provide recreation opportunities to all Americans. National parks like Acadia, the Grand Canyon, and the Great Smoky Mountains, as well as national wildlife refuges, national forests, rivers and lakes, coastal areas, community parks, trails, and ball fields in every state were set aside for Americans to

In 2020, with overwhelming bipartisan majorities, Congress passed the Great American Outdoors Act (GAOA), making the \$900 million mandatory spending beginning in FY2021.


Moreover, the LWCF receives additional revenue under the Gulf of Mexico Energy Security Act of 2006 (GOMESA), which established revenue sharing for the four Gulf oil and gas producing states (Alabama, Louisiana, Mississippi, and Texas). Under GAOA and GOMESA, a combined total of up to \$1.025 billion is available in mandatory spending for LWCF programs for most years.

Because of these dedicated funding streams, banning offshore drilling would bankrupt the LWCF, shattering states' ability to provide access to the great outdoors and wildlife conservation.

How are LWCF Funds Allocated?

The LWCF provides competitive grants to states for local preservation and recreation projects, along with a federal portion to acquire lands and waters for public recreation or cultural resource preservation. The total amount and type of appropriations for the LWCF has been established by Congress.

For the President's FY23 Budget, of the \$900M in mandatory spending, approximately 53 percent or \$481.3M has been allocated for financial assistance to state conservation programs and 47 percent for federal land acquisition (Chart 1). LWCF is a principal funding source for land acquisition by the four major federal land management agencies, the Bureau of Land Management (BLM), the Fish and Wildlife Service (FWS), and the National Park Service (NPS)— all in the U.S. Department of the Interior (DOI)— and the Forest Service (FS) in the Department of Agriculture (USDA) (Chart 2).



Agencies that administer LWCF-funded programs have discretion to use different processes and criteria for prioritizing and allocating appropriations. These processes and criteria are based on the statute, distribution formulas, and state priorities and selection processes determined by field, regional, and headquarter offices. All projects undergo a ranking and scoring process based on criteria, including significance, urgency, management efficiencies, preservation, recreational value, and species and habitat. For outdoor recreation grants to states, the Secretary of the Interior allocates total funding for traditional/formula grants among states. Each state generally awards grant monies based on its own plans, priorities, and selection criteria.

State matching grant funding levels are determined by a population-based formula established under the LWCF Act, with state governments distributing funds to counties and other local governments through competitive grant applications. Through FY2020, these revenues were available only if appropriated in subsequent law (i.e., discretionary spending).




For federal land acquisition, the NPS awards funding through a competitive grant program that prioritizes urban and disadvantaged areas. The Forest Service provides grants to states for the Forest Legacy Program through a competitive process requiring state approval and then federal approval and ranking. Funding is also administered by the FWS that provides assistance for Section 6 consultation under the Endangered Species Act that go to states and territories for acquisition of critical habitat and preservation projects.


State Allocations

Every state and territory in the U.S receives millions of dollars annually from the LWCF. For example, in FY2022, the total amount of funds allocated to the state grant programs was over \$279M, with individual state allocations ranging from \$2M up to \$23M (Chart 3). These funds are a significant investment in conservation, biodiversity, and local parks.

The remainder of this report highlights the various projects that have received LWCF funding during the past few years. It shows the benefits – and it provides insight into the type of projects that would be at risk if LWCF funding were to dry up.









METHODOLOGY

LWCF is responsible for ensuring America's parks, outdoor space, historic sites, and more are adequately funded and protected. Each state and territory has an administrative agency responsible for the approval of grants and allocation of LWCF funds. A general prerequisite to receive funding requires each state and territory to produce a state-wide comprehensive outdoor recreation plan (SCORP).

The information and data included in this report reflects the most publicly available information on LWCF grant allocations to states and territories from 2016 – 2022. There is currently no public and comprehensive database of LWCF funding recipients. Additionally, not all funds are distributed to a specific project and are sometimes diverted to administrative planning (i.e., the SCORP process) and elsewhere.



ConservAmerica's report outlines LWCF projects totaling at least \$1 billion in appropriated grants. Our research reflects an as broad as possible assessment of the LWCF program and is not an exhaustive of all LWCF projects that exist today. Given the timeline and scope of this project, the grant total accumulated is a portion of the programs and communities that have benefited from the existence of the LWCF, and the royalties paid by energy companies into this fund. The state project list was sourced from state administrator websites and data sets, LWCF Coalition website, The Trust for Public Land website, and local news sources. Data cited from outside of the aforementioned sources are indicated as footnotes on the corresponding state page.



ALABAMA

Red Hills: Flat Creek

2019 | AL-01

\$4,928,107 allocated from the LWCF

This project was an acquisition of almost 5,000 acres of Red Hills salamander habitat which protects an amphibian species that only lives in Alabama. Benefits include more public recreational opportunities like additional hunting and

Red Hills: Brown-Schutt

2019 | AL-01

\$4,000,000 allocated from the LWCF

This project was an acquisition of almost 5,000 acres of Red Hills salamander habitat which protects an amphibian species that only lives in Alabama. The acquisition also includes the addition of public recreational opportunities like additional hunting and fishing.

Little River Canyon National Preserve 2022 | AL-04

\$1,150,000 allocated from the LWCF

The Little River Canyon National Preserve was established to protect and preserve the natural, scenic, recreational and cultural resources of the area and to provide for public enjoyment of those resources.

Three Mile Creek Biking & Walking Trail

2016 | AL-01

\$382.525 allocated from the LWCF

The Three Mile Creek Greenway Trail is a community amenity that provides access to one of Mobile's most beautiful natural assets. For over 35-years, citizens, nonprofits and government agencies have been envisioning a pedestrian and biking trail along Three Mile Creek.

Elberta Sportsplex Phase I

2018 | AL-01

\$372,300 allocated from the LWCF

Phase I of the Elberta Sportsplex project includes constructing new fields, wa king trails, parking area and improving drainage at the Sportsplex.

Nesmith Park

2019 | AL-04

\$350,000 allocated from the LWCF

Features a splash pad, recently renovated playground, basketball and paddle tennis courts, multi-use sports fields, a regulation sized baseball field, and other facilities.

Pike Road Ball Fields 2019 | AL-03 \$350,000 allocated from the LWCF

The facility will feature softball and youth baseball fields, an arena that can host equestrian sports and large events, as well spots for gardening and working with livestock.

Stemley Road Park (Veterans Park) Phase I 2019 | AL-03tex \$350,000 allocated from the LWCF

This is a planned park on Stemley Road. The City acquired the one-hundred-and-ninety-acre site for the purpose of a large multi-use park. The planned activities include bathrooms, tennis, pickleball, wa king track, soccer, fishing ponds, playgrounds, elevated trails over wetlands, disc golf, and a recreation building.

Chapman Park

2019 | AL-02

\$348,550 allocated from the LWCF

Chapman Park, located in Huntsville, AL, is a park that offers outdoor recreation and nature preservation, as well as public, open spaces under the maintenance of the Huntsville Parks Department.

Fort Blakely

2018 | AL-01

\$293,354 allocated from the LWCF

Historic Blakeley State Park encompasses more than 2,100 acres of the largest National Register Historic Site in the eastern half of the United States. Within the park's grounds are the site of the last major battle of the Civil War.

Demopolis SportsPlex

2019 | AL-07

\$247.675 allocated from the LWCF

The Demopolis SportsPlex offers pavilions for rent, a community archery park, youth programs and activities, baseball and softball programs, and summer programs.

Summerdale Tennis Courts 2019 | AL-01 \$234,100 allocated from the LWCF

The project will construct four tennis courts. The four lighted courts will be located on 2.5 acres at the intersection of First Street and East Jefferson Street and will include a parking area.

Ditto Landing Marina

2019 | AL-05

\$230,000 allocated from the LWCF

Located on the picturesque Tennessee River at the southern edge of Huntsville, Alabama Ditto Landing marina is nestled in lush greenery, and surrounded by serene mountain foothills.

Bridgeport Park Boat Ramp Improvements 2017 | AL-07

\$200,000 allocated from the LWCF

The project is to construct new boat ramps and a dock and tie-down area at Bridgeport Park on Miller's Ferry. The project includes demolition and removal of the existing ramps.

Collinsville Municipal Park Softball Complex Development 2017 | AL-04

\$198,650 allocated from the LWCF

The project is constructing two girls' softball fields at Collinsville Municipal Park. The fields will meet accessibility standards required by the Americans with Disabilities Act.

Masonic Park 2019 | AL-06 \$175,000 allocated from the LWCF

Located behind the Trussville Public Library, the Masonic Park is a recently renovated, fenced-in playground. Masonic Park is great because it features separate play areas for different age groups. The park features a city pool, a library, pavilions and more.

Springfield City Park Ballfield Improvements

2019 | AL-03

\$175,000 allocated from the LWCF

The city will renovate baseball and softball fields at Springville City Park including press boxes and concession stands and add parking.

Hawkins-Williams Park

2018 | AL-02

\$159,850 allocated from the LWCF

The project will construct a new playground, renovate restrooms, concession stand/press box and softball fields, install benches and replace water fountains at Hawkins-Williams Park.

East Lake Park

2017 | AL-07

\$150,000 allocated from the LWCF

East Lake Park is a 67-acre city park in the East Lake neighborhood of Birmingham. The centerpiece of the park is a 45-acre lake created by the damming of Village Creek in the 1880's.

Brush Creek Campground Development

2016 | AL-05

\$150,000 allocated from the LWCF

Brush Creek Park Campground near Waterloo Alabama offers 50 acres with primitive camping. There is no fee to camp in the park and no electrical hookups, but there are bathroom facilities with cold showers and a dumping station.

Coldwater Mountain Trailhead 2016 | AL-03

\$150,000 allocated from the LWCF

Coldwater Mountain acreage consists of mountainous pinehardwood northwest of I-20 in Calhoun County near Anniston and Oxford. It has a total of 35 miles of bike trail ranging from beginner level to expert. This includes 2 miles of gravity trails.

Haleysville Sports Complex

2016 | AL-04 \$150,000 allocated from the LWCF

Our new Sports Complex has played host to baseball, softball, and football tournaments for communities across Central Alabama.

Arab City Park Splash Pad Development 2017 | AL-04

\$149,763 allocated from the LWCF

The Arab City Swimming Pool is a 25-meter pool with 8 lanes and is open to the public during the summer months. The Splash Pad, just opened in the summer of 2019, is our newest park amenity, and just steps from the pool, it's 3,000 square feet of splash-tastic fun.

Sam Harris Park

2018 | AL-02

\$149,500 allocated from the LWCF

In addition to the new playground, the access ble bathrooms, sidewalk and pavilion were part of the renovation. New benches and trash cans were installed; a new fence, b ke rack and a paved parking lot complete the renovations.

Mike Gilbreath Park

2018 | AL-04

\$142,887 allocated from the LWCF

Features a walking track lined with flowers and flowering trees. Tennis court is open to the public on a first come first serve basis. Playground equipment, a covered pavilion is available for public use.

Semmes Municipal Park Improvements 2016 | AL-01

\$130,000 allocated from the LWCF

The Semmes Municipal Park is located at 8165 Morris Hill Road and consists of a playground, Splash Pad and the Admiral Semmes Disc Golf Course that surrounds a pond that you can fish.

Rogersville Town Park Tennis Courts

2019 | AL-05

\$118,767 allocated from the LWCF

Rogersville City Park consists of forty-two acres of recreational facilities including: three pavilions, four lighted tennis courts, five small picnic shelters, multi-purpose field with stage, walking/jogging trail, playground, and more.

Aaron Park Ball Field Lighting Replacement

2017 | AL-02

\$115,000 allocated from the LWCF

Formerly Carver Park, is located within the Toulminville neighborhood of Mobile.

Cherokee Rock Village Campsite Improvements 2018 | AL-03

\$99,843 allocated from the LWCF

Project includes updating campsites at Cherokee Rock Village including installing water lines, underground electrical lines, signage, drainage and other improvements.

John White Park Improvements

2017 | AL-01

\$98,705 allocated from the LWCF

John White Park is located at the intersection of South Street and South Day Avenue. New playground equipment was installed in 2020 at the park, and a new pavilion and bathroom space was constructed.

Phil Campbell Memorial Park Splash Pad

2016 | AL-04

\$94,875 allocated from the LWCF

The Phil Campbell Memorial Park was dedicated to the victims of the April 27th EF-5 tornado that impacted our area and to the Veterans of this area that gave the ultimate sacrifice to protect our way of life. The project added a splash pad to the existing playground, pavilion and other facilities.

Cedar Point's Reed-Harvey Park Splash Pad Development 2017 | AL-04

\$90,250 allocated from the LWCF

Colorful water sprinklers, large buckets of water splashing children and giggles are all the rage at the new splash pad in Center Point's Reed Harvey Park. After years of planning, the pad and pavilion area is now open.

Addison High School Track Renovation

2017 | AL-04

\$78,153 allocated from the LWCF

Funds revitalized the public school's athletic complex.

Pine Level Park 2016 | AL-02 \$76.953 allocated from the LWCF

The 10-acre park has a shaded ½ mile walking trail, with a cut thru loop to make it a 1/4-mile trail. It also features a playground area, charcoal grills, and park benches.

Historic Riverfront Park Splash Pad

2017 | AL-07

\$75,000 allocated from the LWCF

The splash pad features 20 different water sprays — and a water dump. When it's turned on — kids press the activator button — for up to ten minutes of water fun.

Helena Sports Complex

2017 | AL-06

\$75,000 allocated from the LWCF

Multi-sports complex that has multiple baseball and football fields, indoor and outdoor recreation areas, and restrooms.

Cowarts Walking Trail

2018 | AL-02

\$73,025 allocated from the LWCF

The walking trail is a beautiful 1/2-mile-long paved trail through a wooded landscape. There are benches along the trail for patrons to relax and enjoy the scenery.

Crossville Municipal Park Improvements

2018 | AL-04

\$72,299 allocated from the LWCF

Crossville Park features a pavilion, playground, ball fields, swimming pool and walking track.

Abbeville Recreation Complex

2017 | AL-02

\$62,500 allocated from the LWCF

The features include 3 field complexes for youth and adult softball games with concession stand and press box, 2 lighted tennis courts, 2 covered batting cages, 2 covered picnic pavilions, a playground, and a paved walking trail around the entire facility.

Fyffe Muncipal Park Splash Pad Development 2016 | AL-04

\$60,000 allocated from the LWCF

Fyffe Town Park features a pavilion, Ball Fields, Playground, Basketball Court and Wa king Track. The recent project added a splash pad to the existing park.

Midfield Park Football Field Lighting

2017 | AL-07

\$56,565 allocated from the LWCF

The Project consists of installation of 4 - 60-foot-tall light poles at the football field at Midfield Park.

Allenville Road Park 2016 | AL-02 \$50,000 allocated from the LWCF

Historic waterway upon which the town of Prattville was built. Now a 13-mile canoe trail, with the most popular 3-hour paddle beginning right behind City Hall.

Coosada Town Park Improvements 2018 | AL-02

\$42,000 allocated from the LWCF

Improvements to the park included constructing new sidewalks and bathrooms and renovating a pavilion.

Calhoun County Sports Complex Improvements 2017 | AL-03

\$38,602 allocated from the LWCF

A recreational sports complex located in Anniston, Alabama.

Hurricane Creek Park Enhancements 2017 | AL-07 \$37,550 allocated from the LWCF

The large park, located just off Highway 31 in South Vinemont, is nestled in a 500-foot-deep canyon in the foothills of the Appalachian Mountains called Hurricane Creek Gorge

Cedar Bluff Town Park Improvements 2016 | AL-03 \$24,150 allocated from the LWCF

Park improvements and renovation. The Cedar Bluff Town Park is where you can bring the kids to play and have a picnic on a beautiful sunny day!

Peanut Butter Hill Park Playground Improvements 2019 | AL-02

\$21,631 allocated from the LWCF

Chanshtnu Muldoon Park

2018 | At-Large

\$750,000 allocated from the LWCF

The park encompasses 26.74 acres of natural and previously developed areas, with features that include the South Fork of Chester Creek, outstanding views of the Chugach Mountains, and lush upland forests and open meadows.

Anchor River State Recreation Area

2018 | At-Large

\$400,000 allocated from the LWCF

Anchor River State Recreation Area is one of Alaska's premier fishing destinations on the Kenai Peninsula. The 213-acre recreation area offers a variety of campsite options. The project updated 30 Slidehole campground sites.

Bering Land Bridge National Preserve

2016 | At-Large

\$299,198 allocated from the LWCF

Bering Land Bridge National Preserve is a vital landscape for indigenous communities who depend on the land just as their ancestors did for many generations. It is a wild and ecologically healthy landscape unlike any other.

Katmai National Park and Preserve

2022 | At-Large

\$275,000 allocated from the LWCF

Katmai National Park and Preserve was established in 1918 to protect the volcanically devastated region surrounding Novarupta and the Valley of Ten Thousand Smokes.

Homer Harbor Ramp 2 Restroom Replacement

2018 | At-Large

\$263,340 allocated from the LWCF

Contractors demolished the old restroom located at the Harbor's Ramp 2. A new accessible, more energy efficient and cleanable restroom will be built on the old foundation.

Public Use Cabins at 3 State Recreation Sites 2019 | Statewide \$230.000 allocated from the LWCF

Funds allocated were at state recreation sites across Alaska.

Folker Park

2018 | At-Large

\$225,000 allocated from the LWCF

Folker Park is a 2.02-acre neighborhood park located in the University Area neighborhood. The park serves as a transition area or buffer between the UMED District offices and the residential districts.

Tlingit Park & Harbor

2019 | At-Large

\$216,312 allocated from the LWCF

The project will provide an ADA-accessible ramp at the south end of Tlingit Park connecting to the Portage Cove Trail and Harbor Park and boat launch. It will also upgrade the existing trail through Tlingit Park to ADA accessibility standards and replace the existing pavilion, with an ADA-accessible pavilion.

Lyons Park

2019 | At-Large

\$168,640 allocated from the LWCF

This project is adding a new and improved playground to Lyons Park as well as the addition of a lighting system.

South Denali Trails

\$168,268 allocated from the LWCF

The South Denali Implementation Plan was developed through an interagency partnership with the State of Alaska, the Matanuska-Susitna Borough, and the National Park Service.

Eagle River Nature Center Trailhead

Explorer Walter Mendenhall called the Eagle River Valley "a miniature Yosemite" and its trails offer pristine mountain views, glacier rivers and streams, and abundant Alaskan wildlife.

Denali National Park and Preserve

2022 | At-Large

\$150,000 allocated from the LWCF

Denali National Park and Preserve is six million acres of wild land that contains North America's tallest peak Denali.

Denali State Park Amphitheater & Interpretive Trails

2017 | At-Large

\$148,000 allocated from the LWCF

Denali State Park is an integral part of one of North America's most spectacularly beautiful regions. The park's 325,240 acres provide the visitor with a great variety of recreational opportunities, ranging from roadside camping to wilderness exploration. This project added an amphitheater and interpretive trails.

Matanuska Lakes State Recreation Area

2022 | At-Large

\$141,025 allocated from the LWCF

This popular state park comprises several trout and grayling filled stocked lakes by the Alaska Department of Fish and Game, including Matanuska, Canoe, Irene and Long Lakes. Funds fixed the campgrounds.

Located on the far west side of Sheridan, WY, the 32-acre park includes multi-use sports fields that are currently set up for soccer. Eventually, the park will have a pond, playground equipment, walking paths, an outdoor classroom / amphitheater, and picnic shelters.

Campbell Multi-Purpose Fields

2020 | At-Large

\$500,000 allocated from the LWCF

Funds allocated toward Campbell County's state-of-the-art sports facilities, multipurpose fields, and recreation center.

Constitution Park Master Plan Phase II

2021 | At-Large

\$425,000 allocated from the LWCF

Located in Lovell, WY, Phase 2 upgrades consist of a walking path around the park, an outdoor amphitheater, a pump track, and various pocket parks throughout the property.

Sundance Central Park

2019 | At-Large

\$383,929 allocated from the LWCF

Funds will be used to reclaim a four-block area where the school district's administration building once stood. Plans for the new park include a historic walking path, playground, water feature, landscaping and a covered stage area.

Constitution Park Master Plan Phase I

2020 | At-Large

\$300,000 allocated from the LWCF

Constitution Park located in Lovell, contains a wading pool along with a regulation horseshoe pitching area. There is also a sheltered picnic area with barbeque pits and a large playground area, basketball hoops, skate park and softball

Albany County Sports Complex

2017 | At-Large \$299,838 allocated from the LWCF

Funds supported the addition of a soccer facility as part of the Youth Sports Complex located next to the A bany County Fairgrounds.

Energy Capital Sports Complex Shelters

2021 | At-Large

\$275,000 allocated from the LWCF

This new sports complex spans 320 acres and is home to eight multi-purpose grass fields, eight fastpitch softball fields, four regulation baseball fields and 11 youth league fields.

Popo Agie River Park Acquisition

2021 | At-Large

\$250,000 allocated from the LWCF

The city of Lander's report on the project lists several potential future uses for the 36-acre parcel, including sports fields, increased camping, extension of trails, new fisheries and boating access, and an events stage.

Scout Park Development Plan

2019 | At-Large

\$250,000 allocated from the LWCF

This project includes the installation of a walking path, restroom, two playgrounds for ages two to five and five to twelve, plaza, irrigation/sod repairs and other miscellaneous items.

First Street Gateway

2021 | At-Large

\$246,290 allocated from the LWCF

The project aims to create a riverfront park near First Street along the North Platte River. The plans for the park include a pathway, a boat ramp, an attached parking lot, lighting, park benches, picnic tables, landscaping and a welcome sign.

Malcolm Wallop Pond 2020 | At-Large

\$200,000 allocated from the LWCF

Malcolm Wallop Park is located in Sheridan, WY and funds will be allocated to support the development of a pond within the park.

Greybull Community Pool Bathhouse

2018 | At-Large

\$194,950 allocated from the LWCF

The new swimming pool and pool house will consist of a 6 lane, 25-meter pool located at the corner of South 5th Street and 1st Ave.

Marbleton Community Fishing Pond

2019 | At-Large

\$151,781 allocated from the LWCF

A community fishing pond for families and friends to fish together that was established in 2019.

Campbell Playground and Splash Pad

2020 | At-Large

\$150,000 allocated from the LWCF

A splash pad and American with Disabilities Act-compliant playground is being completed at the Energy Capital Sports Complex in Campbell County.

Lions Park Playground

2017, 2020 | At-Large

\$150,000 and \$136,482 allocated from the LWCF

Located in Cheyenne, this park includes a beach, bike path, boating, boat rentals, Botanic Gardens, fishing, fitness trail, outdoor game areas, picnic facilities, rental shelters, swimming pool, and amphitheater. Funds allocated also specifically supported the addition of a larger picnic shelter.

Pine Bluffs Splash Pad

2019 | At-Large

\$137,850 allocated from the LWCF

Pine Bluffs Town Council applied for a grant to resurface the community swimming pool and install a splash pad, resurface the parking lot, install a playground at the adjacent park and soccer field and lastly, improve the Leaning Rock Golf Course.

Green River Riverside Memorial Park

2020 | At-Large

\$125,000 allocated from the LWCF

A park that offers outdoor recreation and nature preservation. A public space open to the general public, the Park offers open spaces under the maintenance of the Green River Parks Department.

Seminoe State Park

2018 | At-Large

\$125,000 allocated from the LWCF

Seminoe State Park, located on the northwest side of the reservoir, was established in 1965 through an agreement between the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation and the Wyoming Recreation Commission. Funds allocated were specifically used to conduct electrical updates.

Scout Park Phase 3 Development

2016 | At-Large

\$125,000 allocated from the LWCF

Phase 3 will include an in-park eight-foot-wide path and playgrounds for the 2-5-year-old age group and the 5-12year-old age group.

Curt Gowdy State Park Campground Upgrade

2017, 2018 | At-Large

\$120,500 and \$50,399 allocated from the LWCF

Curt Gowdy is located between Laramie and Cheyenne, WY and contains three reservoirs, endless recreation and unforgettable experiences.

Curt Gowdy State Park Camping Cabins Upgrade

2017, 2018 | At-Large

\$115,624 and \$317,000 allocated from the LWCF

Curt Gowdy is located between Laramie and Cheyenne, WY and contains three reservoirs, endless recreation and unforgettable experiences.

Riverton City Park

2017 | At-Large

\$117,940 allocated from the LWCF

The City of Riverton has seven City parks and 8 miles of recreational paths that the Parks and Recreation employees maintain. While the parks have a variety of amenities available, funds allocated supported the development of a splash pad.

Thayne Park Irrigation

\$112.500 allocated from the LWCF

Thayne, Wyoming, in the heart of Star Valley, is surrounded by three National Forests. The town has 2 parks within Thayne.

Washington Park Playground

Washington Park is a public park with a playground, bandshell/stage, picnic tables and public restrooms.

Lander Rodeo Arena Bleachers

2017 | At-Large

\$107,500 allocated from the LWCF

Lander Old Time Rodeo Association is a member-driven volunteer-run indoor riding arena and rodeo grounds that puts on the oldest paid rodeo in the world.

Glendo State Park

2018 | At-Large

\$105,000 allocated from the LWCF

Glendo State Park is a 22,000-acre park in Platte County Wyoming and exists on and around Glendo Reservoir. Funds allocated supported the addition of vault toilets.

Powers Field Synthetic Turf Replacement

2019 | At-Large

\$103,000 allocated from the LWCF

Located in Cheyenne WY, the field is home to the Champion American Legion Post 6 baseball team, boasts an artificial surface and has ample room for expansion.

Energy Capital Sports Complex

2021 | At-Large \$75,000 allocated from the LWCF

This new sports complex spans 320 acres and is home to eight multi-purpose grass fields, eight fastpitch softball fields, four regulation baseball fields and 11 youth league fields. Funds supported new pathways, an access ble playground, and updates to lighting, irrigation, and landscape.

Romero & Sun Valley Parks Playground Safety Surfacing

2021 | At-Large

\$75,000 allocated from the LWCF

Both located in Cheyenne, funds were allocated to complete the installation of synthetic turf safety surfacing at David R. Romero Park, a 5–12-year-old playground approximately 3,027 square feet, and Sun Valley Park, with both a 2–5-year-old and 5–12-year-old playground.

Cahill Park

2016 | At-Large \$65,000 allocated from the LWCF

Funds allocated were used to create a universally accessible playground in Cahill Park in Cheyenne, WY.
